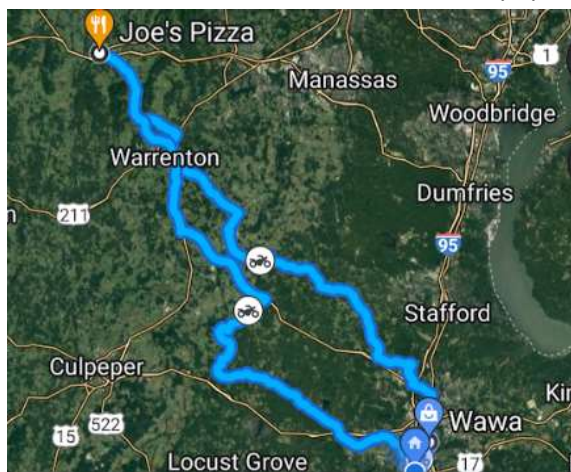
Virginia Grand Tour

In this month's newsletter, I wanted to spend a few moments telling you about the



2022 Virginia Grand Tour that a number of us are participating in. This tour is sponsored every year by Honda Riders of Tidewater VA Motorcycle Club in Norfolk. They plan and organize a 15 stop tour of Virginia, print Passport Books that they cover the cost of, then sell them for \$20 each with all proceeds going to support the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation and the Virginia Ride for Kids. I asked their leader to come to our April meeting and a number of us purchased the passports that night. As I said, there are 15 destinations that you can ride to throughout Virginia so this has given us some focused riding. Our Thursday riding group, the ROMEOS, have started the tour and we have visited 4 locations so far. When you visit a location, there is a question in the passport book that needs to be answered for that specific location. For instance, we rode to Saluda Virginia and had to go to Christ Church

Graveyard, find the grave of LTGEN Lewis "Chesty" Puller USMC, and list the name of the person buried to his left. This upcoming week we are riding to Brucetown (north of Winchester), go to the Brucetown United Methodist Church, then answer the question "What is not allowed on the church parking lot." (see the picture) After we visit the location, we look for a mom and pop restaurant and stop for lunch, then



head home. As we get further into this, a few of the locations are more than 4 hours riding time each way, so we might make one or two of these overnight trips. The point is, we are riding to many different places we have never been, learning new roads, and just having a great time doing it. At this time the ROMEOS (Retired Outstanding Motorcyclists Enjoying Outdoor Scenery) are doing this, but if some of our non-retired riders want to participate, I would be happy to re-visit some of the places again on the weekend for your benefit.

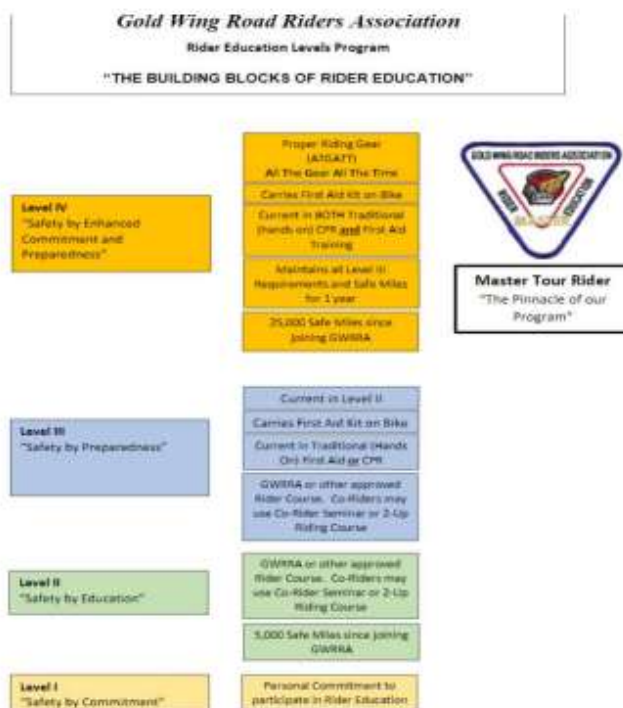

Picking the right eye protection

This month I decided to talk to you about eye protection and very important element in your safety that is often overlooked. Almost all bike riders will wear glasses or goggles at some time when riding, whether to correct vision, dull the bright sun or protect the eyes. Before you purchase a pair of glasses, though, you'll need to make sure that they fit within your helmet and are comfortable while wearing your helmet. Some helmets have a pre-cut groove in the padding along the temples where the glasses' arms can sit so that the helmet doesn't force the arms against the temples and behind the ears which can be quite uncomfortable on a long trip. Glasses specifically designed for helmet use often have padded arms, usually a neoprene or foam. Softer padding doesn't last as long (especially if you let it get wet or dirty) but will be more comfortable in the short term.

If the helmet doesn't have pre-cut grooves, grooves will eventually form over time as you wear your helmet with the glasses. This might mean that a small amount of discomfort initially could become comfortable over time, like buying a new pair of shoes.

Glasses with large lenses might not fit under the helmet. If they are pushed down by the padding over the brow or around the cheeks it will cause discomfort on the bridge of your nose.

Lenses not only correct your vision and reduce glare, but they can protect your eyes against flying projectiles. Glasses used when riding should have shatterproof polycarbonate lenses and a lightweight nylon frame. The lenses should provide 100% UV protection. To reduce glare, use polarized lenses. Orange or yellow lenses can help improve clarity on dull days. You will need non-tinted lenses for nighttime riding (light yellow tints are OK for nighttime, but not dark sunglasses).

Some glasses support interchangeable lenses and these are useful if you have prescription lenses and want prescription sunglasses. The sunglasses lenses can either clip on (in which case they don't need to offer any additional correction), or replace the clear lenses.

The lenses can fog up easily, especially in a full-face helmet where you are breathing humid air into the helmet, so invest in some anti-fogging products. You can reduce the chances of this by wearing your glasses for 15-30 minutes before using them outside as this will normalize them to the temperature of your head.

The arms should not be too thick as they will compromise your peripheral vision by blocking your view sideways. Your peripheral vision is already compromised by wearing a helmet.

To get the best fit, you should take your helmet to the glasses vendor and try glasses on while wearing your helmet. Put your helmet on first then put your glasses on through the visor. Make sure that the frames at the top and bottom don't obscure your view and create extra blind spots while you are riding.

You can also choose Googles, if you have an open face helmet then you can purchase prescription goggles, or just wear uncorrected goggles for general eye protection. Choose goggles with a comfortable strap and vents to avoid issues with fogging. Worn over a long period of time, goggles can put pressure on your brow and cheeks and the bridge of your nose, leading to discomfort. Goggles can restrict your peripheral vision quite significantly making it more difficult for you to see other vehicles in your blind spots.

Whatever you choose (glasses or goggles), you should never ride without eye protection. Even at 25 miles per hour a stone flicked up from a vehicle coming in the opposite direction could hit your eye at enough speed to blind you. Being hit in the eye even with a small insect is painful and your instinctive reaction could cause you to crash, particularly if you are mid-turn.

It is very important that you insist that passengers also wear eye protection for their safety and comfort.

Finally, when storing your glasses or goggles, store them properly so that it avoids scratches. Scratches can affect your vision, particularly in bright sun. With sunglasses and glasses, check the screws periodically to ensure they have not worked loose and lead to one of the arms falling off, or a lens becoming loose. Ensure that you follow the manufacturer's instructions when cleaning your glasses or goggles.

At the Chapter Gathering last month there was some discussion about the GWRRA Level System. We all were challenging our memories about the details of the system and what was required for each level. Below you will find a summary of the requirements for each level in the GWRRA Level System. Hopefully this will be a useful reference to help you decide which Level fits you.

GWRRA Level System

Basically there are four levels:

1. Safety by Commitment
2. Safety by Education
3. Safety by Preparedness
4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Each level requires that you are a member of the GWRRA and you have completed the previous level. The rider and co-rider requirements for each level are as follows:

Level 1: Safety By Commitment

Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

- The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

Level 2: Safety By Education

Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding. Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/shirt (no riding pull on/off sleeves), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear. Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).

10 Uses of Old Devices



Our devices these days are slimmer and more powerful than a lot of personal computers. They have cameras built in and all of the apps that you could possibly want. Let's look at some ways to use your older devices. You paid for it! There is an afterlife! Put it to use!

1 – Sell it

You may not get full-on retail for it, but at least you can recover some of the cost but as long as you took good care of it, it should draw a premium. eBay and Gazelle are great ways to sell your device.



Want to insert a picture from your files or add a shape, text box, or table? You got it! On the Insert tab of the ribbon, just tap the option you need.

If you decide to hang on to it and not sell it, here are some great ways to put it to use. Having access to wifi will add to the number of choices that you have. You might be wondering how to power your device if you use it in a semi-permanent location. Try Aukey Power Banks (<https://www.aukey.com/product-category/power/?tax=power-banks#power-banks>) as a power source instead of plugging them in. Just a thought.

2 – Entertainment Center

Get yourself a good set of Bluetooth speakers and your iPad becomes your dedicated music and radio system, with the added advantage of guests also being able to play their music through your system.

3 – Homemade Recipe Box

iPads make great recipe books and shopping list managers for the kitchen -- just attach them to your wall. If you're creative enough and handy with some basic tools, you can design a box that the iPad can fit in (as the lid?) that holds things like cookie cutters or chip clips.



4 – Elaborate Timepiece

There are some really cool clock apps on the App Store that you can download and maybe mount on the wall in a hallway or something. Check out Alarm Clock HD or you can search on alarm clock on the App Store.

5 – Remote Control

If you have a smart TV, you can download the manufacturer's app, like the Samsung Smart View app that controls most Samsung smart TVs.

6 – Security Device

This is something that I have been looking to do. There are some apps out there like Many things that allow you to continuously record, complete with live streaming. If you have this setup, I would love to hear your thoughts on what to use and how you use it.

7 – In-Car Entertainment

Your older iPad could become you're in-car entertainment, messaging and navigation system left permanently in your vehicle so you never go without. Take a look at RAM Mount or Modular for mounts.

8 – Education for Kids

Pop your old iPad in a heavy-duty case and it could become a perfect entertainment center for your kids -- just install a range of fun child-friendly apps and books and set the parental controls to prevent accidental purchases.

9 – Jailbreak

It seems inevitable jailbreaking will become popular among those wanting to squeeze more use out of older iOS devices -- particularly as newer apps cease to work on older hardware. Some users might install XBMC others may explore the host of available (but inherently less secure --be warned) apps.

So there you have it -- a series of fun things you can do with your old iPad (or other iOS device) when the time comes to upgrade.

10 – Donate it

There's no shortage of organizations seeking iOS devices to use for good causes, for example the Holly Rod Foundation which will donate the tablet to special needs children -- Macworld has a lengthy list here.
