Not Just A Triathlon

When I participated in my first triathlon, I expected to see the participants all look like Mr. Atlas and Physical Fitness Barbie: bodybuilders, professional athletes, maybe college athletes; people in the prime of physical fitness and condition. While there were many excellent specimens of the human body in top shape, I was pleasantly surprised to find the majority of participants are what I call "regular people". Many were not even competing, but participating to prove they could, or as a personal challenge, and some just marked off an item on their bucket list.

Personally, having spent a long career in the Army, I don't find anything "fun" about rock climbing, mountain climbing, riding a bike 25 miles or - unless you're being chased by the T-Rex in Jurassic Park - RUNNING!! When you're required to run for a living, doing so as "fun" just doesn't compute. But that's me; to each, his own. When asked do I like marathon running, my answer is "YES! I can watch marathon runners all day!" And I compliment and tip my hat to all the triathletes ... as I ride by on my Gold Wing.

Then I worked the Patriots Triathlon Festival in Williamsburg, September 9th & 10th. Saturday was as usual, I guess. One difference was the officials were from USA Triathlon HQ in Colorado. Their instructions and briefing seemed more serious, more inclusive than those I attended before. The reason: Sunday's event was the 2023 USA Paratriathlon National Championships. Not only was it part of the qualifications process to participate in the Para-Olympics, but it included a \$20,000 cash purse.



Sunday there was also a Sprint triathlon running simultaneously. Sprint triathlon is an entry-level event with shorter distances for the swim, bike ride and run. It rained all Saturday afternoon and night. The rain stopped just as Claude and I arrived at the venue Sunday morning, with Butch arriving shortly thereafter. Prediction was the rain would hold-off until after the day's events. As I watched the participants arriving and preparing to enter the water, I took note of the para-athletes. I don't think I've ever been more impressed by the dedication, strength and sheer guts these athlete's display.

Participants included every variation of limb amputation, and paraplegics. Bicycles were custom equipped for riders missing a hand or arm, foot or leg. I was totally in awe watching one bicyclist mount at the start line and ride away on a bike with only one peddle. Then came hand-cyclists, these are athletes partially paralyzed, sort-of lying on their back and hand-peddling a three-wheeled bike. There was a slight incline from where they mounted their cycles to the actual starting line, and although being pushed up the hill was allowed, most athletes declined the help and struggled up the incline, just to get to the actual starting line. Each exuded a determination in their faces, their voices I don't think I'd ever witnessed before.

Then there were tandem bicycles ("a bicycle built for two") wherein one athlete is blind and the other his/her guide. Speaking with a USA Triathlon Official I learned some teams are siblings, other friends who set out training together, but many teams are paired together. This requires athletes who volunteer and train as guides, and then the process of matching a guide with a para-athlete, looking for similar stamina and other compatibles. Although I only rode the bicycle route, I did see swimmers coming out of the water, and later runners, who are actually tethered together by a short cord. So, it was evident how athletic abilities between the athlete and guide is so significant.

I rode the bike route with Brian, the videographer, and we endeavored to capture on film every para athlete we could catch up to on the route. As remarkable as the athleticism of these folks demonstrated on their various bicycles, this was the only event I witnessed. They were equally as impressive in the swimming and running events.

The events are the same: 750-meter swim, 13-mile bike and 3.1-mile run. Paratriathlon National Championships offered development Para triathletes the opportunity to race in the spotlight as U.S. Elite Paratriathlon National Team members focused on final preparation for the 2023 World Triathlon Para World Championships later this month in Pontevedra, Spain. Ten U.S. para-athletes earned national titles Sunday.

Para-athletes are nothing new, but I'd never personally witnessed them compete before, and I was both impressed and inspired. I'm at the age now that my knees hurt, a couple fingers ache and my shoulder is stiff. And I stood there watching these athletes and was reminded of the old adage of the man complaining that his shoes make his feet hurt when he looks across the street and there's a fellow with no legs. I went on the web and read some about par-athletes. Seems none of their equipment is cheap: a running blade costs up to \$6,000; the hand-cycles described above go for as much as \$16,000. The ten national champions named that day were from VA, NY, Texas, New Mexico, North Carolina, Iowa, Ohio and Michigan.

And with all the training, sacrifice and dedication of these athletes, you'd be amazed how many thank US for being there, working the races, watching out for them out on the route. For me, it makes doing the triathlons worth it. Not to mention the officials and videographer: we've heard that at most races

they're on crotch-rockets or noisy Harleys. One judge said he spent the day riding on the back of a Vespa scooter! So you know how glad they are to see a line of Gold Wings - the best motorcycles on the road - arriving as their chariot for the day.

So, consider coming out and helping with our triathlon schedule. And by all means, if you get a chance to watch or witness para-athletes in action, don't miss it. I pray you might be half as inspired as I am.

Tech Tips *from the Webmaster*



If you're a television watcher, you probably want the best channels, a variety of channels, but you also want the best price, you might find yourself subscribing to several types of services to satisfy your itch. As a result, this may not be an inexpensive approach. Cutting the cord , i.e. ditching Verizon or Comcast (losing the cable service), might be a viable solution in accommodating your taste in movies and live TV. Let's look at Hulu as a replacement to Verizon or Comcast cable service.

Hulu is effectively an app that can be found (or downloaded) on smart TVs or devices such as Apple TV, smart phone, laptop, or on popular gaming consoles. And any of these devices can be connected to a TV that does not have inherent app support.

Pros

Hulu is portable. Because you can use a smart phone, tablet, or laptop, you can use your Hulu subscription on any of these devices while on business travel, vacation, or just sitting beside the pool with your favorite beverage.

No wires. Depending on how you have it set up in your home, there are typically fewer cables and wires as many of the devices that run Hulu are connected over your home WiFi or your favorite cellular network. Even modern external speakers might hook up over Bluetooth, furthering your no-wire quest.

Cons

You can't surf the guide and watch TV at the same time, which most cable and streaming services will allow you to do. Also, the guide is unintuitive. You'd expect to see your local channels first, followed by the bigger cable networks, and finally the niche and premium channels. Instead, they're all thrown together in the guide. Further, you don't see all channels by default,

but rather only the most recent channels you've seen. To access all the channels ,you'll need to move to a different view. There's also a "Favorites" option in there, which is the only way I've figured out how to save my local channels in one place to surf them quickly.

A dealbreaker in the future might be a price bump, making it more expensive than Verizon or Comcast, but right now it's a dead heat. At some point the commercials might become so annoying I'd want to go back to a classic DVR. If Hulu lost another live channel, that might swing me. But for right now, if you move around, or just don't want to get into it with a cable company, Hulu does make a convenient replacement.

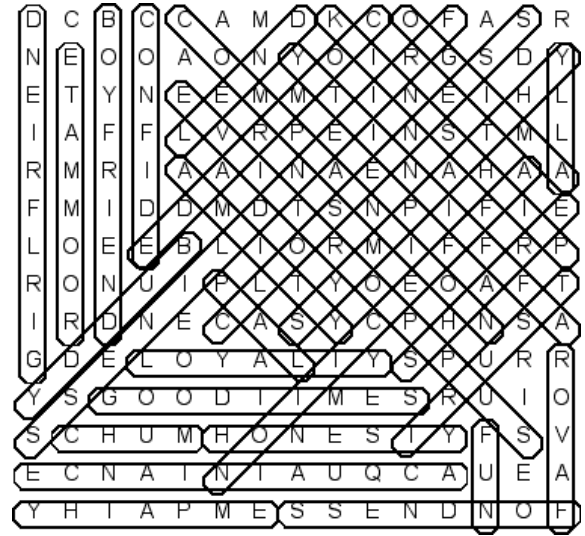
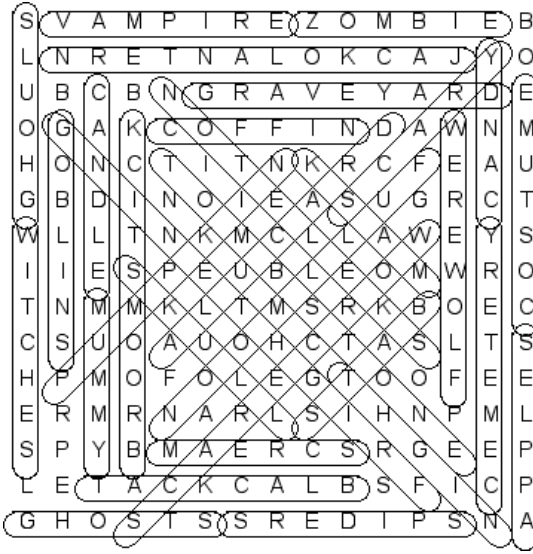
