Motorcyclists Wrap Up from the General Assembly

March 13, 2024

The Virginia General Assembly wrapped up its 2024 Session this past Saturday. While It was generally a quiet session for Virginia motorcyclists, we did have some important victories this year, as well as a couple of minor disappointments. We will begin where we knew we would this year - motor vehicle exhaust bills.

House Bills 883 and 884 would have made significant changes to the regulation of motor vehicle exhausts in Virginia. Neither bill passed.

HB 883 would have expanded the locations where law enforcement could enforce motor vehicle exhaust violations, to include not just highways, but any driveway or premises of a church, school, recreational facility, or business, as well as any governmental property open to the public. The Virginia Coalition of Motorcyclists (VCOM) took no position on this bill as it did not have an impact on motorcycles that are currently street legal. The bill came out of the House Transportation Committee, but was re-referred to the Committee on Public Safety where it was left without getting a hearing, and therefore died.

HB 884 was a more problematic bill, as it created a decibel level threshold of 95 decibels for motor vehicle exhausts, but only in Northern Virginia. This bill was really aimed at loud cars which are a problem in Northern Virginia. The bill made a violation of it a civil offense, and set up an odd and complicated system of enforcement and compliance. Rather than fight the bill, members of VCOM met with the bill's patron who agreed to amend the bill so as not to include motorcycles. Once that amendment was made, we no longer had an interest in the bill. However, the bill has not passed. It was continued over to 2025 so that Finance and Appropriations can take a longer look at the financial impact of the enforcement and compliance system that the bill seeks to put in place for the residents of Northern Virginia. However, let me reiterate that this bill no longer applies to motorcycles.

There were two bills that VCOM supported that did not go our way. The first was HB 1411 which sought to exclude from the sale price for determining motor vehicle sales and use tax the amount of any credit given by the seller for any motor vehicle taken as a trade-in. In other

words, if you buy a \$10,000 vehicle and your trade-in is worth \$5,000, then you would only pay sales tax on \$5,000, not \$10,000. VCOM supported that change to the law, and had the bill amended to ensure that motorcycles were included in the new sales tax calculation. However, that was not enough to allay the concerns of the legislators over the financial impact of the bill, and it never made it out of sub-committee.

The other bill that VCOM supported, HB 1257, passed the General Assembly, but not in the form that we had hoped for. HB 1257 sought to require insurance policies covering damage to personal property to provide coverage for the diminution in the value of such personal property. Under the bill, the diminution in value of the personal property is the amount, if any, by which the market value of the personal property immediately following the completion of repair of the damage to the personal property is less than the market value of the personal property immediately prior to the damage. So, under the original bill, if you were on a motorcycle worth \$10,000 and somebody hit it causing \$3,000 worth of damage, and after it was repaired it was worth \$9,000, the insurance company would owe the \$3,000 in repairs AND the \$1,000 in diminished value.

All was going well with the bill until the insurance industry got nervous and had the bill amended so as to only apply to homeowners insurance and any scheduled property rider associated with a homeowners policy. Perhaps we can get motor vehicles included next year.

Webmaster from the Rob Hardisty

This tech tip isn't geared toward motorcycles per se, but the idea of home security reaches out to many facets of your life. Staying vigilant is something we all should practice all of the time. Keeping your home and family safe is the reason we stay vigilant and wouldn't you want the same peace of mind if you're away from home? Security cameras can provide that peace of mind. But which ones are right for me?



WiFi security cameras are a popular option for outdoor security cameras because of their convenience. With WiFi security cameras, you don't have to worry about wires. When dealing with outdoor camera placement, this can be incredibly beneficial. However, when dealing with WiFi security cameras, you have to make sure you are within range of your internet. Depending on the size of your yard or driveway, this might be the right option or

not.

One of the key features you might want to consider, is if the camera is recording 100% of the time. Similar to a dashcam, you can have the security camera record to local storage (i.e. external hard drive, SD Card, etc.) which is also a great way to review old footage. Recording to local storage saves you, in some cases, from having to pay subscriptions to cloud services who store your security camera footage on their servers. These services are very convenient because you do not have to worry about set up and you can access your recordings from anywhere via the vendor app or some web service.



For cameras that do not record 100% of the time, such as wifi cameras or cordless (i.e. battery operated or powered by a solar panel) cams, there is typically a motion sensor that is always on (usually using a lower voltage) and when the motion sensor triggers, the camera turns and begins recording. In most cases, this is perfectly fine, but you might miss what led up to the event because the motion sensor may not have triggered in time. And

in some cases, you may miss the object that triggered it in the first place.

Meanwhile, remote viewing can be applied to all sorts of security camera systems. If you want to be able to view your home security footage while away, this is an excellent feature to consider. In fact, most homeowners who have a home security system choose to take advantage of remote viewing.


