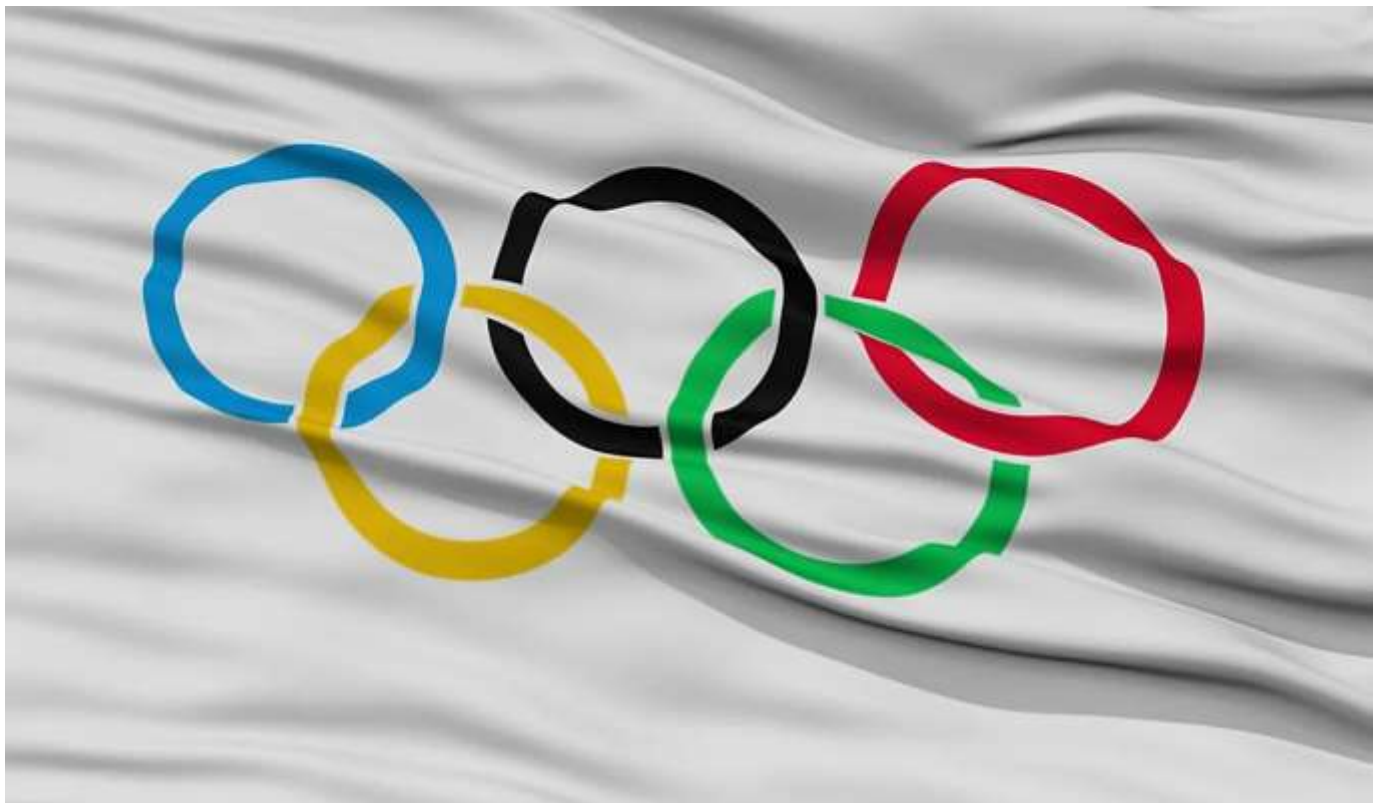

Your phone is smart, your home is smart, even your lawn mower is so smart that you can just turn it on and leave it while it cuts your grass by itself while you go back inside to play with your motorcycle. But has motorcycle technology taken all of the fun out of riding in modern-day motorcycles? Let's take a look at a few technologies and you can decide for yourself.

Antilock Braking Systems (ABS)

Antilock braking systems use wheel-speed sensors to determine when, during braking situations, your wheel might lock up—and then prevent that from happening by rapidly reducing and reapplying brake pressure multiple times per second. And the technology works: The fatal-crash rate for motorcycles with optional ABS is 31 percent lower than for the same models without ABS, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety. In addition, motorcycles are increasingly coming equipped with cornering ABS—which uses inertial measurement unit (IMU) data, along with ABS and throttle control, to help keep the bike stable in tight turns and emergency situations.

Adaptive Headlights

Most modern automobiles are coming equipped with technology that predicts the general direction of travel enabling your headlights to turn in the direction you are traveling. However, headlights have always been a weak point for motorcycles because of their relatively small size and output. And typical older-model, low-beam motorcycle headlights aren't great at illuminating what's ahead while you're rounding dark corners. Adaptive headlights (available on some bikes, plus as aftermarket devices) use electronic sensors and various types of gimbals pivot the headlight(s) with the motorcycle as you take a corner—so the light shines where you're going, as opposed to straight ahead of the bike.

Bike to Bike Communications

While spontaneously hitting the open road by yourself, much of the time we are riding in a group, anywhere from a couple of bikes to groups in the double digits. Communication between your partners might be a great way to pass the time while riding, but also has its advantages from a safety perspective. Now under development, vehicle-to-vehicle (V2V) technology—which uses a short-range radio network that allows vehicles to “talk” to each other—is the next frontier in roadway safety. V2V technology would make a motorcycle’s presence known to the cars it’s sharing the road with. If the car is talking to the bike and vice versa, you won’t have to make as much of an effort to be seen, because both rider and driver are going to be aware of each other.

These are just a few technologies that you might find in modern motorcycles, so you be the judge. If you are a new rider, then you may see these as essential but if you’re a seasoned rider, then options like these may not be a priority for you if buying a modern motorcycle.

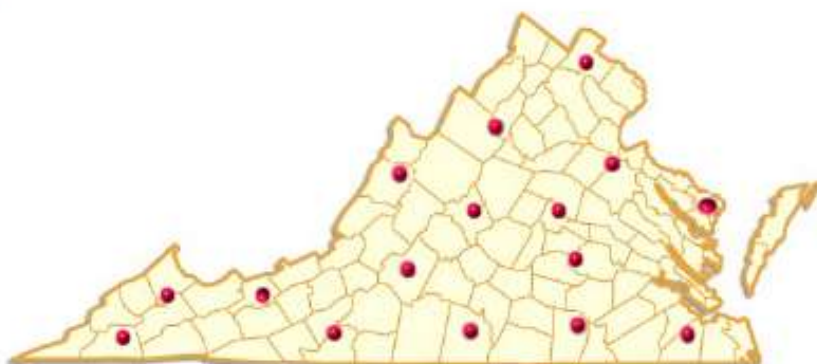
